MOROCCO – Erasmus+ promotional caravan and capacity building in Morocco

The goal of the project was to organise a promotional caravan of Erasmus+ which supported establishing local communities and promotion of Erasmus+ at university level. Within two weeks the caravan visited 11 higher education institutions covering major cities of Morocco and reaching approximately 2000 university students and teachers.
