

EU Support to the Erasmus+ Student and Alumni networks: Overview of EOI Submissions

Introduction

The Erasmus+ Support Programme – facilitating alumni activities

The Erasmus+ Support Programme provides operational support to four Erasmus+ student and alumni networks: EMA, OCEANS, ESN, garagErasmus, and two regional platforms, ASAFA, and WBAA. The programme helps network members organise local, community-based activities which have:

- A central aim of promoting and informing the participants about the opportunities offered by Erasmus+, to reach out to and inspire potentially new participants to the programme.
- A local, community-based focus, enabling local members to engage with young people in their own communities and networks.

A range of different activities can be supported including opportunities for networking and professional development, promoting European Union programmes to wider audiences, sharing personal Erasmus+ experiences to encourage engagement, initiating grassroots activities to benefit their local communities, and providing mentoring to guide and inspire future Erasmus+ participants.

Activities must be supported by network boards and take place in eligible countries. Support is allocated strategically across regions, with 40% directed to EU Member States and associated countries, 20% to Sub-Saharan Africa, and smaller amounts to other global regions such as Western Balkans, South Mediterranean, Asia, Latin America, and North America.

Cross-network collaboration is also encouraged, and the activities can be carried out in collaboration with the EU Delegations (EUDs), Erasmus+ National Focal Points (ENFPs) and other relevant EU and national/local stakeholders, helping to increase the activities' impact and reach.


Overview of 2025 activities

In 2025, Erasmus+ alumni members, volunteered their time and skills to organise 100 activities reaching over 6,000 participants in their local communities and countries. The Activities had a strong focus on engagement of alumni, motivating future Erasmus+ participants and positively impact their communities.

The activities supported encompassed a broad spectrum, including networking and professional development sessions, events and workshops to raise awareness about European Union programmes to wider audiences, opportunities to share personal Erasmus+ experiences and motivate others, grassroots initiatives encompassing volunteering and local community outreach, and mentoring to guide and inspire prospective Erasmus+ participants.

The activities took place across a diverse geography (see map below), with 36% of activities taking place in EU Member States and associated countries, 32% in Sub-Saharan Africa, 10% in Asia and the remainder distributed among regions such as the Western Balkans, South Mediterranean, Latin America, and North America.

The EOI Submission and assessment process

EU Support for these Alumni- led activities was accessed by Network members through the submission of an Expression of Interest (EOI) form to their respective Boards. These were then shortlisted by the Boards and submitted to the ESS team for assessment of strategic fit with the Support Programme objectives.

There were three deadlines for EOI in January, March and September 2025. In addition, a small number of individual activities were approved on a case-by-case basis by the Erasmus+ Support Services Team and EACEA during the year to support attendance at select Commission and alumni events.

Review panel process

Following the conclusion of each assessment round, the ESS Team prepares an assessment recommendations list identifying the EOIs recommended for support.

The ESAA Liaison Group and EACEA form a review panel to discuss the EOIs and make the final decisions on the activities to be supported. Activities are then formally approved by the Head of unit at EACEA.
